	2.2	Report from HCCIIr Jackie Porter: HCCIIr Porter provided a written report (Appendix 1)which drew attention to the Hampshire Police and Crime Commissioner's surveyhttp://s.alchemer.eu/s3/Public-VAWG-Survey-2022which seeks to collect evidence inrelation to violence against women and girls and summarised County Council planningand regulatory matters.In addition, HCCIIr Porter noted that the County Council, Citizens Advice Bureau, schoolsand colleges all have funding available for households experiencing financial difficulties. Anumber of residents have asked Jackie how they can help and she has suggesteddonating to Winchester Villages Trust. She has suggested to the Trust that they add adonate button on their website.The Hampshire Local Transport Plan is out for consultation again until 26 <sup>th</sup> June.		
	2.3	Report from WCCIIr Stephen Godfrey: WCCIIr Godfrey observed that there have been more pony and trap racing incidents on the A33 in the last few weeks. These have been reported by residents and WCCIIr Godfrey asked that all incidents continue to be reported. He noted that 101 on-line can be used if the telephone number is busy. The City Council are providing support and advice for those hosting Ukrainian refugees but HCC are the lead authority on this. South Wonston Parish Council have confirmed that they wish to join with Wonston Parish Council for the Greening Campaign but noted that the headteacher of the school is not keen for the school to be involved.Natural England are now requiring all planning applications to deal with phosphate mitigation and this is delaying applications in affected areas. Southern Water have no responsibility for preventing phosphates entering water courses. One City Council seat for this ward is up for election on 5 <sup>th</sup> May. Following the virtual meeting held with the WCC Strategic Planning Team to discuss the proposed allocation of additional new houses in the Parish, WCCIIr Godfrey suggested asking for a time extension to collect feedback and opinions from residents. He noted that South Wonston School have turned down 23 pupils from Worthy Down in the past year.
